

Preparing for bushfires: safety checklist

Bushfire survival plan

It is recommended that every home and business in a bushfire prone area has a bushfire survival plan in place. Home and business owners should consider the following when preparing a survival plan:

- Is the home adequately constructed, maintained and prepared to withstand the impact of fire?
- Are you capable of making bushfire preparations for your property and family?
- Does the plan cater for young, elderly or infirm residents?
- In the event of a rapid onset fire, where is the nearest shelter and how you families get there?
- Do you have the necessary knowledge, skills, confidence and fire fighting equipment to protect your property?
- Is fire fighting equipment well maintained and does everyone in the house know how to use it?
- If you make the decision to leave early, where will you go, how will you get there and what will you take?

Preparing your property

- Cut back any overhanging trees or shrubs and dispose of cuttings appropriately. Keep grass short.
- Check the condition of the roof and walls. Repair any damage to roof tiles and close gaps in the walls. Enclose underfloor areas
- Clean leaves from the roof and gutters and fit quality metal leaf guards. Screen the vents on roof voids with fine metal wire mesh.
- Remove any flammable items, including woodpiles and garden piles, or store them away from the house.
- Install the correct fire protection equipment and service it regularly.
- Ensure adequate water storage and distribution facilities are in place. Invest in a long hose which can reach every part of the house. Consider purchasing a portable pump to use from your swimming pool or water tank.

During bushfire season

- Closely monitor media reports and observe fire danger ratings and fire bans issued by fire departments.
- Prepare pets and livestock. At the start of bushfire season, consider slashing a paddock to create a safer area for relocating livestock.
- At the start of bushfire season, double check the location of and routes to neighbourhood safe centres.
